Kathleen Wrasama (1917–?)

Born in Ethiopia, Kathleen Wrasama came to England as a child in 1917. During the 1930s, Wrasama moved to London and worked as an extra in films with Paul Robeson, and later established a Black seaman's mission in Stepney with her husband. She was a founder member of the Stepney Coloured Peoples Association, an organisation committed to improving community relations, education and housing for black people. [References](#)
